The non-RSPO volumes relate to PKE where we continue to face challenges. In this respect we are continuing to work with our supplier, and to demonstrate the responsible sourcing credentials of the product we procure to be compliant. In this respect, the supplier is working to obtain RSPO certification for their plantations (sources and owned) and mills. Our supplier (Wilmar) is working with smallholders to support their ability to obtain RSPO Certification, facilitate access to replanting and provide technical assistance to enhance capabilities for best agricultural management practices.

The target outlined in the Fonterra Group Palm Product Standard was to achieve 100 percent segregated supply of palm oil purchases by the end of 2018. Due to challenges in some regions, we have been unable to do this (as outlined in previous ACOP reports). We have moved towards "mass balance" and where not practicable for supply issues (for example, Chile, the Middle East) we have utilised Book and Claim. In light of further detailed investigations, we are in the process of reviewing the existing Fonterra Standard and discussing with our regional markets the challenges, barriers and opportunities in moving towards this 100 percent segregated supply target. We expect to have a new standard in place with specific regional deadlines by end of 2021.

We are in the process of reviewing our internal standard which includes a commitment towards moving to 100 percent segregated sourced palm oil. This will be in place by the end of 2021. In doing this, we are working with each market individually to understand the constraints, barriers and opportunities. This approach provides a more in-depth understanding as to "why" the previous target was not been met, and seeks to ensure that any new time-bound commitment can be achieved. This is noting that we have made significant progress (and ongoing) since 2018 despite our own "Fonterra" target not having been achieved.

## **Shared Responsibility**

The Board of Governors of the Roundtable on Sustainable Palm Oil approved new Shared Responsibility rules on 31 October 2019, requiring all members to share sustainability requirements and obligations. Our standard requires that suppliers commit to supporting smallholders within a mill catchment area to encourage adoption of good practice. Our PKE is sourced from Wilmar which has programmes to support independent smallholder RSPO Certification, facilitate access to finance for replanting and provide technical advice to enhance capabilities for best agricultural management practices. Our Policy outlines that supplies commit to "work[ing] with smallholders within mill catchment areas to encourage the adoption of good environmental practices, improve productivity and develop fair business arrangements". Wilmar has a programme to support smallholder RSPO certification and facilitation access to finance for replanting.

We continue to work with suppliers to improve traceability and supply chain performance. Also challenges face for progressing RSPO certification for low volume unusual fractions.
