The data for Baker & Baker's latest ACOP submission varies significantly to our 2020 statistics, due to two significant business separations that have concluded in the last year.
Our business was previously named CSM Bakery Solutions, however, from April 2021, this entity no longer exists. The remaining business has been rebranded as Baker & Baker, following the sale of our ingredients arm, CSM Ingredients.
Later in 2021, Baker & Baker completed the divestment of its North American business, Brill Inc., which further altered the make-up and geographical footprint of our organisation.
As a result, Baker & Baker is now almost purely a manufacturer of finished bakery products, with an extremely limited operation continuing to create bakery ingredients, based in Europe. As such, the overall footprint of our business has changed substantially. The data included in this year's submission does not include those of CSM Ingredients and Brill Inc., which will be reported separately, if required, by those businesses.
In 2021, we held a call with RSPO's Shared Responsibility Team, where we outlined the impact of these two business separations, and the challenges around comparing year-on-year data following their divestments. It was agreed that Baker & Baker could review and implement a new reporting period.
Therefore, we are proposing that 2021 represents our new baseline year for our future ACOP submissions.
