In 2018 we reached 100% certified coverage for Tier 1 materials (Palm Oil and Palm Kernel Oil). We have maintained 100% certified coverage of our tier 1 materials preferring RSPO certified materials, but also with a mix of Rainforest Alliance Certified Palm Oil. In 2021, in addition to the RSPO physically certified palm oil and PKO reported as RSPO certified, Colgate also purchased 30,524 MT of Rainforest Alliance Certified palm oil and palm kernel oil.

We continue working with our palm derivatives suppliers to increase the usage of RSPO physically certified materials. As part of our global responsible sourcing strategy for palm we combine this effort with the transformation projects and opportunities identified with our direct suppliers, supporting RSPO certification work. We continue to use RSPO certificates to cover the gap between physically certified derivative purchases in our total purchases. We have a 2025 goal for all tier 1 and derivative volumes to be 100% physically certified palm oil.
