Permanent support continues for FFB suppliers in the implementation of the RSPO P&C, reinforcing the environmental, social and technical aspects.

It was necessary to postpone the inclusion of the four suppliers proposed in the follow-up audit defined for the year 2021, due to the fact that there were still some gaps in criteria at the environmental and social level that could result in non-compliance with critical indicators within the standard. Therefore, an improvement plan is being worked on in order to reinforce and have the necessary evidence to guarantee compliance and be able to be included in the follow-up audit defined for the year 2022.

There is a second group projected for the year 2023 that is in the process of documentation and implementation of the RSPO P&C, adaptation of infrastructure, staff training and compliance with applicable legal requirements; and a third group that due to economic issues are in a slower process where they are working on the documentation and staff training phase.

Hacienda la Cabaña and the group of suppliers maintain a strong commitment to the implementation and continuous improvement of the RSPO P&C, guaranteeing the sustainability of our oil.
