The project, which ran between 2017 and 2021, focused on improving smallholder farmers' knowledge on Best Environmental Practices and on agriculture that respects High Conservation Values (HCV) and natural forests. In 2022 we have noticed the impact of the Ukraine/Russian war on our palm oil supply chains.
