In a sus eco oil fem	2023 GGC arranged TOPSA training for farmers to educate them in RSPO certification and laws atted to oil palm planting. The training also prepares these farmers for membership enrolment. addition to a mastery of oil palm varieties, the training equipped participants with knowledge of tainable and environment-friendly oil palm plantation and awareness of the need to preserve the system as well as resource conservation and GHG emissions. This enabled farmers' sustainable palm production. A total of 1,154 smallholders completed RSPO training, 38% of whom were nales. As a result, GGC took part in the well-being of those involved in this project and targets east 800 smallholders to be so certified in 2024.
