We are still facing problems of palm oil reputation with the marketing services of finished products manufacturers. RSPO is not well known by final consumers who are still reluctant with palm oil consumption. We are developping support to our customers for acquisition of RSPO supply chain system knowledge, training and promotion of RSPO sustainable palm oil supply chain. We are member of the ASD (Action for Sustainable Derivatives) since 2020. ASD's Framework for Action includes four workstreams: *Transparency & Risk Assessment * Monitoring & Grievances Management * Supply & Market Transformation * Positive Impact Together with other ASD members we financially contribute to the KALEKA Mosaik Initiative.

In the frame of the ASD, we choose to opt for the service of monitoring satellite NUSANTARA ATLAS. Due to incoming regulation EUDR we face a market which is wondering if the Supply chain Mass Balance certification has still an interest.

We are pushing our customers since we deployed in 2020 the strategy to sell 100 % certified mass balance products. Our position applies to all industry sectors including cosmetics, pharmaceutical, food and industrial markets.
