Whilst setting clear expectations for our own products is an important first step, we don't think this is sufficient. We want to work with our suppliers and the palm oil traders they source from to ensure that they are not contributing to deforestation elsewhere in their operations. We know this will be achieved progressively, but by working with other retailers and manufacturers we believe we can send a clear market signal to bring sector-wide change. We have developed a set of expectations and best practise as part of the CGF Forest Positive Coalition of Action, and have been engaging our supply chain partners on these. Engaging in production landscapes means going beyond our own supply chain and addressing the root causes of deforestation, taking into account economic and social factors at production level. In 2021, we committed to supporting a Rainforest Alliance industry initiative that aims to improve smallholder livelihoods in Sintang, West Kalimantan. This initiative aims to promote better farming practices that increase yields whilst lowering the pressure on native vegetation. Thus far, we have contributed £300,000 to support the project until 2026.
