- 1. Snack sales were down in South Africa because of potato shortages.
- 2. There was a scare due potential toxin presence in maize snacks packaging in the informal trade. This resulted in decreased sales to the maize snack industry.
- 3. Several of our customers volumes appear to have dropped possibly due to the depressed economy.
