- The approval of the RACP project, especially we facilitated, takes time. Since the approval becomes a precondition for certification, this has became a problem for company who process their certification.
- There is no clear regulation-based guidance for the width of river buffer & steep terrain conservation in Indonesia, yet. This guidance is important for the companies to follow to make sure in line with the RSPO requirement and government regulation. This challenge already resolved based on Indonesia RSPO river and riparian management document and confirm to use standard norms for river border width in accordance with PP No.38/2011. The Steep terrain and soil conservation still lack clear guidance from the new P&C 2024 and still waiting for national interpretation.
