In May 2018, Boustead acquired Pertama Group estates 11,579.31 plantation land in District of Labuk and Sugut From Duta Plantation. In May 2019, Boustead acquired from Sit Seng & Sons Reality 4,915.25ha together with 45 tonnes per hour palm oil mill and rename the estate and mill Boustead Tawai Estate and Boustead Tawai Palm Oil Mill respectively. New acquisition shall be certified within 3 years time frame.

We have been utilising RSPO PalmGHG version 4.0.1. This will aid us in completing our baseline studies as well as identification and estimation of the potential sources of emission and sinks of carbon from our operations, including mitigation plan in minimising net GHG emissions. We will develop target baseline in our next report in 2020.
